In the academic years 2015-2018, 100% of graduating students passed the School's final examination.

Graduate Satisfaction

Beginning in 2017, the School of Urban and Regional Planning surveyed students who graduated five years prior. For the class of 2013, 88% were either highly or somewhat satisfied with the way our program prepared them for their current employment.
